Introduction

Railway is the commercial organization responsible for operating a system of transportation for trains that pull passengers or fright. It is a line of track providing a rail road track. Rail transport is a means of conveyance of passengers and goods, by way of wheeled vehicles running on rails. Indian Railways owned a total route length of 64,000 kilometers, 2,16,717 wagons, 39,263 coaches, 7,739 locomotives and runs about a total of 12,000 passenger trains and 7,000 freight trains daily. It carries nearly 23 million passengers every day and transports over 2.65 million tons of freight daily. The Head Quarters of the Indian Railways is in New Delhi. Indian Railways are controlled by the Government of India through the Ministry of Railways. At present, there are 17 zones and 68 divisions in the Indian Railways. Indian Railways has identified model stations for the provision of upgraded passenger amenities. Some of the stations have been identified for provision of certain 'touch and feel items' to transform them into modern stations in order to bring about visible improvements at stations. Indian Railways has been making efforts over the past few years to enhance the service being providing to their passengers.

Statement of the Problem

The railway passengers face long term competitive threats from airlines, luxury buses, personalized transport and improved public transport. Though there are competitions from various modes of transport, the railway has its own unique features and provides more services to the passengers. In order to compete with other modes of transport, it is inevitable for railways to accelerate the growth of passengers' origination. There are many services provided by the Indian railways. The researcher tries to find out the respondents satisfaction

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level as well as the problems faced by the respondents. So this research work is under taken by the researcher.

Scope of the Study

Objectives of the Study

Methodology

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Problems Faced While Travelling

Railway is the most convenient mode of transport for the movement of large scale goods as well as for long- distance travel. Sometimes the passengers faced many difficulties and problems while travelling in the train. It is analysed with the help of Garret's ranking technique.

From the above table it is inferred that out of the seven respondents, "Theft" ranks first with the mean score of 54.57. "Time schedule" ranks seconds with the mean score of 49.86. The least rank is given to "Water" with the mean score of 44.97. Eventhough, policemen are available in all the compartments, theft occurs often, so the people hesitate to travel in trains. The railway department do not follow the time schedule already fixed by them. In some stations, they unnecessarily set down the train for long time. So the respondents cannot arrive the destination within the prescribed time. It will affect their work so the respondents prefer other modes of transport rather than trains.

Policy Implications

The researcher gives the following suggestions based on the study made.

- In festival seasons additional trains may be arranged inorder to avoid overcrowding.
- CCTV Camera may be fixed, then only if there is any malpractice happens, it will be detected easily.
- As per the time schedule if the trains arrive the stations, passengers tension may be reduced, because they are very time conscious.
- Women are reluctant to travel in train alone. Because there is no assurance for them. So the railway department can arrange proper security especially to the women passengers.

Conclusion

The researcher made a thorough analysis towards the satisfaction level as well as the problems faced by the respondents towards the Indian Railway Service. The researcher arrived at the conclusion that the respondents are work much satisfied with the Rangelore



express train because of the numerous facilities available in that train. The main problem faced by the respondents while travelling is that, often theft occurs in the train, eventhough proper security are arranged by the railway department. So the railway department should give proper assurance to the people. Then only they can travel in the train without any fear.

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
